The Town Board of the Town of Onondaga met at a regular meeting at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 3, 2026 , at the Town of Onondaga Town Hall, 5020 Ball Road, Syracuse, New York.

1. Pledge of Allegiance

2. Public Comment

a) **Bussey Road resident Paul Jenkins** was in attendance to discuss the Town’s responsibility for the maintenance of the **Browning Cemetery** located at 3841 Bussey Road, which he said is in very poor condition. He said his residence is adjacent to the property, and he tries to maintain the property as best as he can. He said that after doing some research, he discovered that according to NYS Town Law Sec. 291, the Town of Onondaga holds stewardship over the grounds to ensure the cemetery is preserved and not built over. He circulated a printed handout, which indicated that the cemetery is legally classified as an abandoned family cemetery, and that it is situated immediately adjacent to privately owned active farmlands and residential properties. The handout also pointed out that because it is an inactive, historic site, regular grass cutting and brush clearing are generally managed by the Town or local volunteer groups such as the Town of Onondaga Historical Society. He is asking the Town to take a look at the cemetery and offer whatever maintenance they can provide.

b) **Town resident and Town Planning Board Chairman, Marc Malfitano** of Jupiter Inlet Way, was in attendance to present to the Town Board some concerns he has about an unsolicited e-mail he received this past Friday, from Codes Director Jeffrey Herrick. Supervisor Mahar made a motion to immediately move into Executive Session as this is a personnel matter, inviting Marc Malfitano into the meeting.

The Town of Onondaga Town Board moved to Executive Session at 5:03 p.m. The Town Board returned from Executive Session at 5:27 p.m. with no action taken. The regular meeting of the Town Board resumed at 5:27 p.m.

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3. Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad Byway – Resolution

Nikita Jankowski – President/Founder of Belesai Communications, LLC was in attendance to provide some information and seek the Town’s support for the inclusion of the 550 mile Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad Byway (HTURB). Information and a proposed resolution was given to the Town Board and Town Attorney prior to the meeting for review, which generated a concern/inquiry from our Town Attorney Nadine Bell. Attorney Bell said her only concern is that off premises signage is only allowed in the *light industrial* zoning district. Ms. Jankowski said that the route will come from East to West, from Route 5 going through Fayetteville, Manlius, Erie Blvd, through downtown, to Solvay, Geddes and then Fay Road, which is where it enters the Town. From there it goes to Harris Rd., Seneca Tpke (Rte. 175) to Lee Mulroy and Skaneateles. Ms. Jankowski said this stretch in the Town will be one of the last pieces, along with Marcellus, in Onondaga County to complete the byway. It will be a 550 mile byway across the state of New York. Town Attorney Nadine Bell reviewed the Town’s zoning map, and discussion took place about the *light industrial* signage requirements and it was determined that this would fall within the guidelines of the Town’s zoning laws. Ms. Jankowski said that NY State DOT will have directional signage identifying the Harriet Tubman byway. The following resolution resulted:

Resolution for Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway Nomination and Corridor Management Plan Adoption

The following resolution was offered by **Supervisor Mahar** and seconded by **Councilor Wheatley** to wit:

WHEREAS, the historic qualities of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, as described in the corridor management plan, and the surrounding areas have been appreciated and celebrated for over a century by the residents of New York State, as well as tourists, historians, artists, authors, and other visitors to the region; and it is this unique combination of the journeys of Harriet Tubman and those Freedom Seekers who traveled on the Underground Railroad that create the special sense of place that is vital in telling the New York story of the human desire for freedom and the historic sites they utilized during their journey to emancipation; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, composed of representatives of 22 municipalities along the proposed scenic byway route, committed to working cooperatively to protect and promote the historic, scenic, recreational, and economic well-being of the 550-mile Corridor throughout the state and agreed to pursue the nomination of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway; and

WHEREAS, under the leadership of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway Steering Committee, each of the 22 counties contributed to the development of this corridor management plan by encouraging public participation, confirming the vision and goals, and leading individual meetings of the Collaborative; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, consisting of relatives of Harriet Tubman, descendants of Freedom Seekers, Harriet Tubman and/or Underground Railroad historians, representatives from state and federal agencies, has strengthened the historic integrity, representation, and the principles of the corridor management plan; and

WHEREAS, in the process of developing this corridor management plan, the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway Steering Committee has strengthened the bonds of inter-municipal cooperation, and the involved entities envision further benefit through scenic byway designation including sustained collaborative progress, increased funding opportunities for recommendations identified in the plan, enhanced partnerships with agencies responsible for the stewardship of resources along and adjacent to the byway route, and an improved visitor experience that interprets and promotes the corridor's intrinsic qualities and resources; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Onondaga supports the designation of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway which includes programs for stewardship and enhancement of the historic scenic byway and guidance to manage future activities along its corridor; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Onondaga confirms that they will not approve any requests for new off-premise outdoor advertising signs along the designated Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway route; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Onondaga confirms that they will abide by and follow all existing New York State and Federal laws and regulations that are applicable to this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Onondaga will work in partnership with the other municipalities along the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway and local and regional stakeholders in order to support future Byway programs, economic development, marketing, and collaborate with these interested entities to explore opportunities for cooperation to realize the Scenic Byway goals.

Building and Code Director Jeff Herrick reported that his department has completed 4 inspections and 12 building permits since his last report. He said they inspected two festivals in the Town, at which he found no issues. He also reported that next week Municipity and Laserfiche will be integrated. Mr. Herrick also referred to his report at the last meeting of two children being hurt at the abandoned home on Brookside Drive. He said the structure has since been boarded up, but he has not heard from the owner, and although he has been to the location twice, he has not seen him either time. It appears that the owner, Jason Bartlett, is living in Otisco currently. Codes Director Herrick has attempted to contact him but has been unsuccessful.

b) Local Law B-2026 - Battery Energy Storage Systems Moratorium Extension – Set Public Hearing

Town Attorney Nadine Bell reported that at the March 25th meeting, a six-month moratorium on battery energy storage systems was passed and took effect 4/1/26. That is set to expire on 10/1, and Attorney Bell requested the following resolution:

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Supervisor Mahar introduced proposed Local Law No. B-2026 regarding extending a moratorium on the siting, establishment, placement, installation, construction, erection, modification and enlargement of battery energy storage systems within the Town of Onondaga for an additional six (6) months and made the following Resolution, which was seconded by Councilor Goodwin:

WHEREAS, continuing this moratorium will enable the Town to further its review and comprehensive analysis of the issues involved with battery energy storage systems; and

WHEREAS, the Town recognizes the potential benefits and desirability of battery energy storage systems, but determines that additional time and research is necessary to determine how to properly regulate such systems; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has deemed this moratorium urgent and immediately necessary in order to preserve status quo while this issue is examined by the Town; and

WHEREAS, no other agency has the legal authority or jurisdiction to approve or directly undertake the enactment of Local Laws in the Town of Onondaga, such that there are no other involved agencies within the meaning of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) with respect to the proposed enactment of said Local Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that there are no other involved agencies, the Town Board shall act as lead agency, and that the enactment of this proposed local law, is a Type II action under SEQRA, thus concluding the environmental review process; be it further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that the Town Board shall conduct a public hearing as to the enactment of proposed Local Law B-2026 at the Town of Onondaga Town Hall located at 5020 Ball Road, Syracuse, New York 13215 on **August 17, 2026, at 5:30 p.m.**, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, at which time all persons interested in the subject shall be heard.

**TOWN OF ONONDAGA
PROPOSED LOCAL LAW NO. B-2026**

**A Local Law Extending a Moratorium on Battery Energy Storage Systems
in the Town of Onondaga**

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Onondaga, as follows:

Section 1. The moratorium prohibiting the siting, establishment, placement, installation, construction, erection, modification and enlargement of battery energy storage systems within the Town of Onondaga was originally passed by the Town of Onondaga Town Board on March 25, 2026, as Local Law No. 1-2026, and filed with the New York State Department of State on April 1, 2026. Local Law No. 1-2026 is hereby extended for an additional six (6) months or until the Town of Onondaga enacts comprehensive legislation regulating such uses, whichever shall first occur.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect on October 1, 2026, upon the expiration of the existing moratorium period set forth in Local Law No. 1-2026.
